The revised version of the Annual Report Questionnaire is set to be proposed, and likely approved, by the Commission on Narcotic Drugs in March 2020. The latest draft made available in August 2019 shows significant improvements in incorporating many aspects of the operational recommendations included within the UNGASS Outcome Document. However, gaps remain in collecting data on drugs and issues related to health, human rights, criminal justice and development, covered in the Outcome Document and the Sustainable Development Goals. This side event aims to highlight ways to complement the ARQ with additional datasets from other stakeholders, and to reflect on the diverse ways in which these additional data could be submitted to feed into future World Drug Reports and upcoming biennial reports of the UNODC Executive Director, using experiences from other UN agencies.

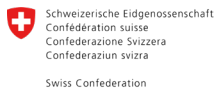
